## Administration

The teacher is asked to rate on a 5-point scale: 'not true at all', 'seldom true', 'sometimes true', 'quite often true', or 'very often true' to indicate how often each of the items occur for the child. There is no set time period over which the judgment has to be made. The response is made by circling the appropriate frequency word.

## Scoring

Only items 1 through to 22 are scored. The responses are scored:
Not True at All $=0$
Seldom True = 1
Sometimes True $=2$
Quite Often True= 3
Very Often True $=4$
This yields a maximum possible total anxiety score of 88 . The sub-scale scores are then computed by adding the individual item scores on the set of items as follows:

| Subscale Scoring | Items (sum of ratings) |
| :--- | :--- |
| Generalized Anxiety | $2+5+11+21$ |
| Social Anxiety | $6+9+12+15+19$ |
| Obsessive Compulsive disorder | $3+8+14+17+20$ |
| Physical Injury Fears | $7+16$ |
| Separation Anxiety | $1+4+10+13+18+22$ |
| Total Score | Sum of Scores for Items 1 to 22 |
